

1. The division of society into groups arranged in a social ranking based on access to wealth, power, and prestige

2. The awareness that a class structure exists and feeling of shared identification with others in one's class with whom one perceives common life chances

3. A measure of class standing, typically indicated by income, occupational prestige, and educational attainment

5. A widely held but fixed and oversimplified image or idea of a particular type of person or group

6. A special right, advantage, or immunity granted or available only to a particular person or group of people

7. The movement of individuals, families, or other groups of people within or between social classes

8. The organized pattern of social class in society

9. A group of people who share similar and distinct physical characteristics, as well as shared cultural practices and traits
