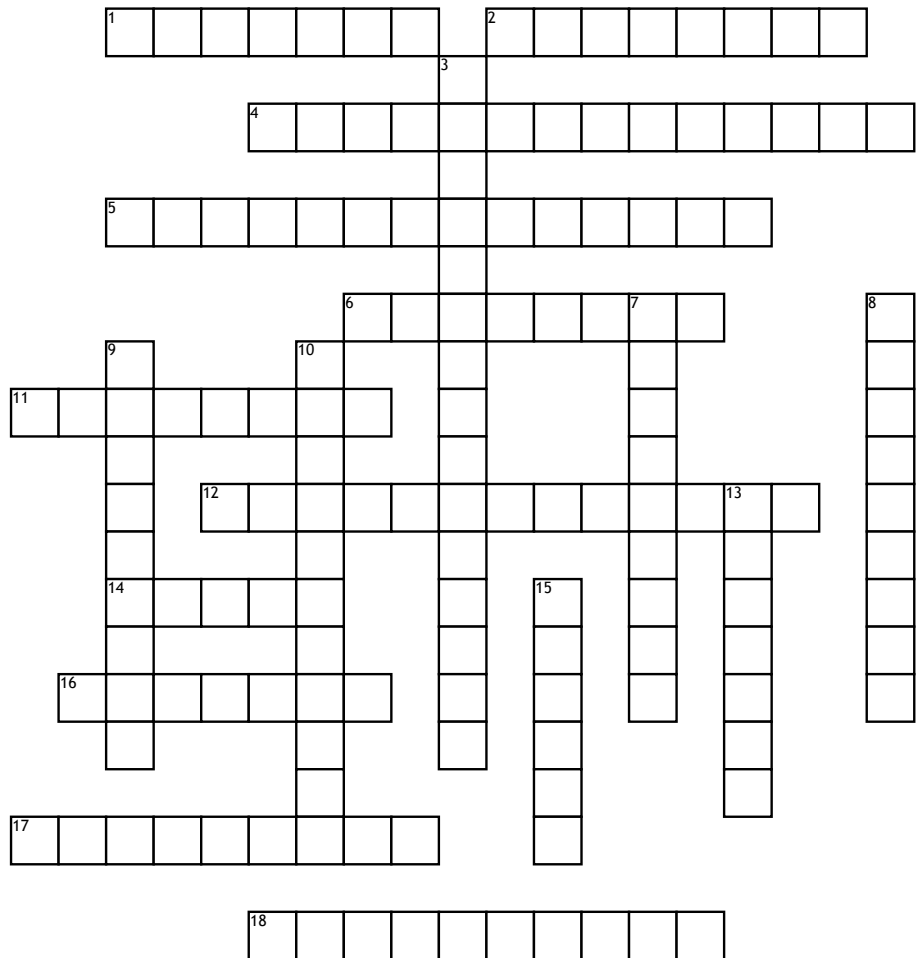


# Absolute Monarchy in Spain and France
