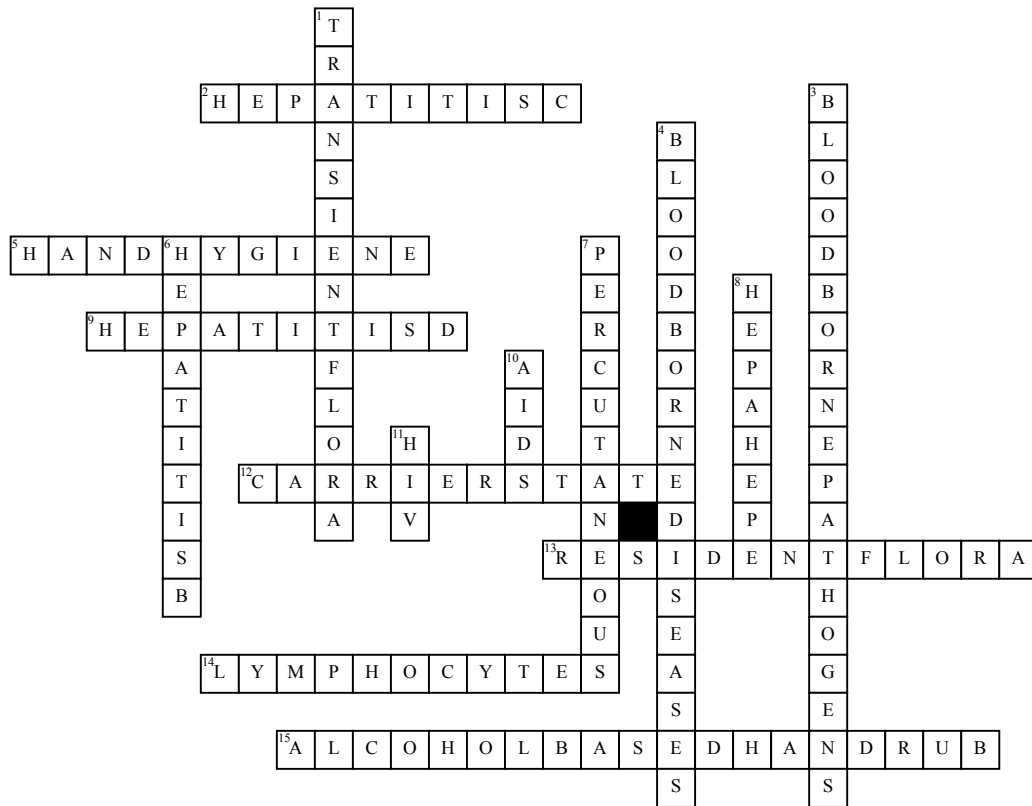


# Bloodborne Pathogens/Hand Hygiene
