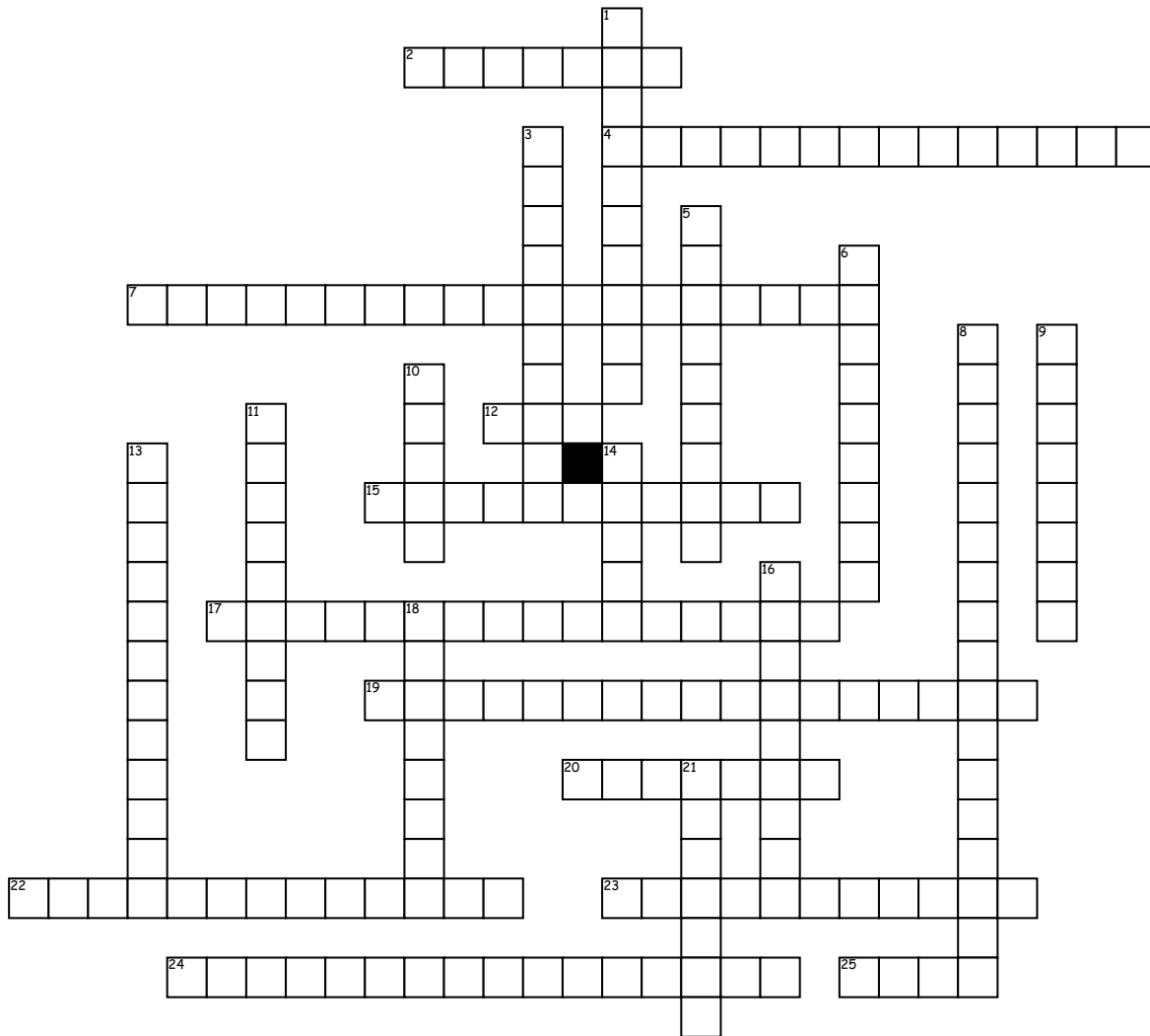


New Testament Crossword Puzzle
