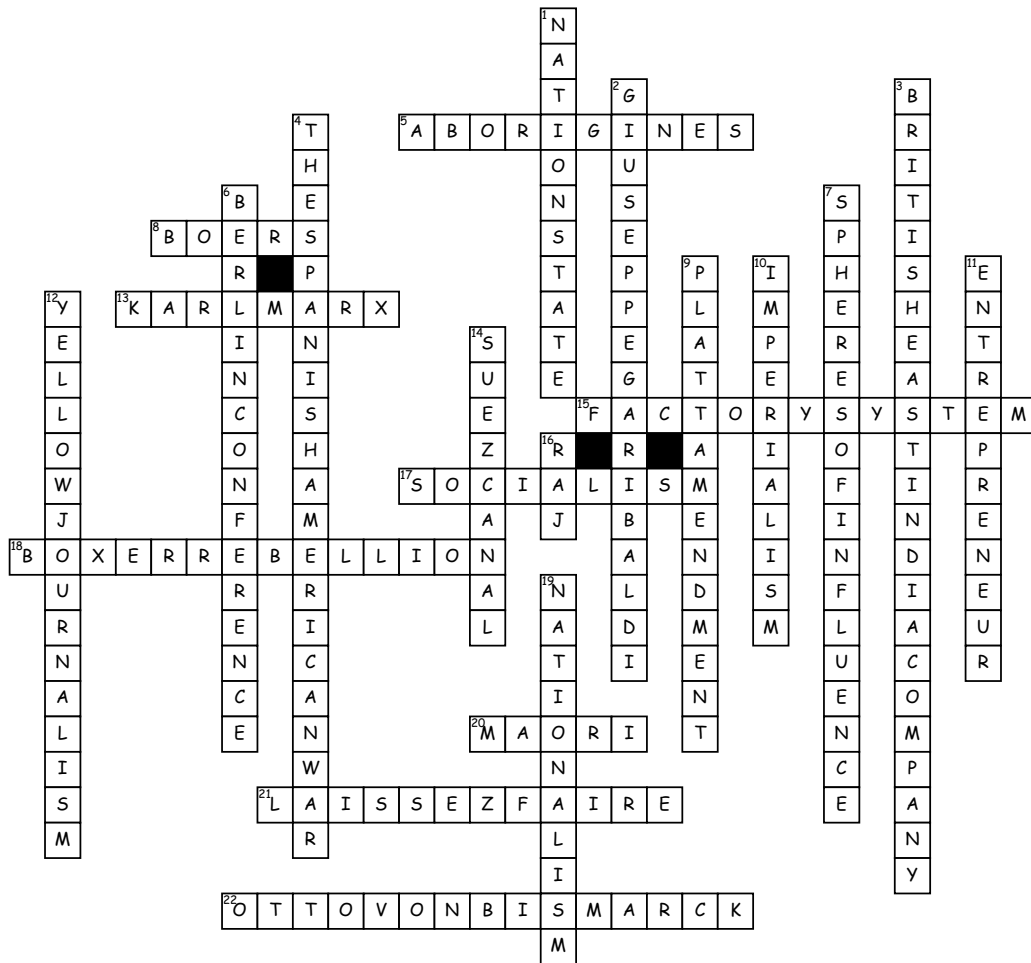


Industrial Revolution Crossword

 4. The U.S. declared war on Spain following the sinking of the Battleship Maine in Havana harbor. The war ended with the signing of the Treaty of Paris which resulted in Spain losing control over their territories including: Cuba, Puerto Rico, the Philippines, Guam
 6. a meeting of European leaders at which a plan to divide Africa was made

7. areas in China over which other countries had economic power

9. amendment to Cuba's constitution that limited Cuba's right to make treaties and allowed the U.S. to intervene in Cuban affairs
