

Corsage and Boutonniere Preperation

- **2.** thin green wire used to strengthen and lengthen stems
- 3. waterproof adhesive which will not brown leaves and is used to attach floral materials
- **4.** long, slender bladed scissors used to cut ribbon, wire, fabric and fine netting
- $\boldsymbol{8.}$ smaller stem which attaches a leaf to the main stem
- 9. straight or hook bladed knife used to cut floral stems
- **12.** corsage wiring technique in which a wire is inserted through the calyx and bent downward along the stem
- **14.** used to support the flowers and help with manipulation when constructing a corsage or houtoniere.
- **15.** turned back portion of a jacket or coat which lays flat and is a continuance of the collar
- **18.** a small floral adornment worn by women; No. 3 ribbon and 24 to 28 gauge wire is most commonly used in corsage work

- 19. small branch bearing buds, flowers or berries
- **22.** leaves or buds growing on the side of the main stem
- **23.** condition of a plant cell when it has absorbed the maximum amount of water
- **25.** floral adornment worn by men and pinned onto the lapel of the jacket
- **27.** small undeveloped shoot, leaf or flower located at the tip of a stem

- 1. stretchable tape which adheres to itself, used to lengthen and strengthen stems
- **5.** quick drying, waterproof adhesive that will not brown leaves; available in liquid, spray and tape forms
- **6.** substance which is sprayed on the stems and leaves of plants to reduce the rate of transpiration, or water loss
- 7. supplies, methods and materials which designers use to place and hold flowers and foliage in an arrangement

- **10.** used to cut through very thick or tough floral materials with one cut
- **11.** color scheme which uses different hues and shades of one color
- 13. used to hide the mechanics in a flower arrangement; commonly stems with lots of leaves and green materials; also referred to as greenery
- **16.** ocation within a design which attracts the most attention or the center of interest; in a corsage, the focal point is where the largest flower is placed
- 17. waterproof, all-purpose tape
- **20.** the bottom part of the flower bud or blossom, consisting of the outermost sepals; usually wider than the stem and green
- 21. clusters of flowers used to fill spaces between larger flowers creating depth
- 24. triangular shape
- **26.** spring action handle with shorts blades used to cut heavy duty wire and boutonniere and corsage stems
