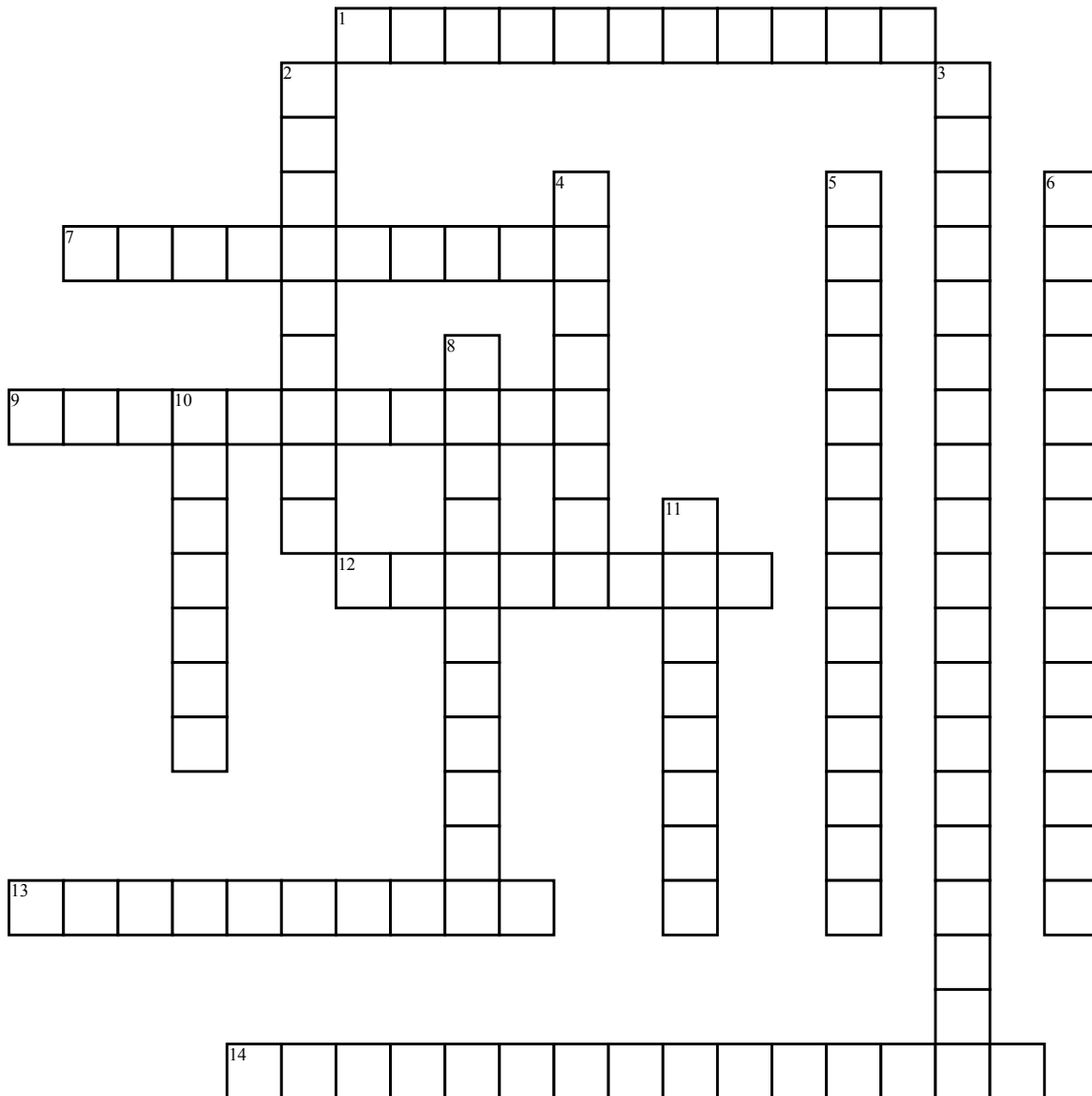

1. The policy or practice of acquiring full or partial control over another country, occupying it with settlers, and exploiting it economically.
