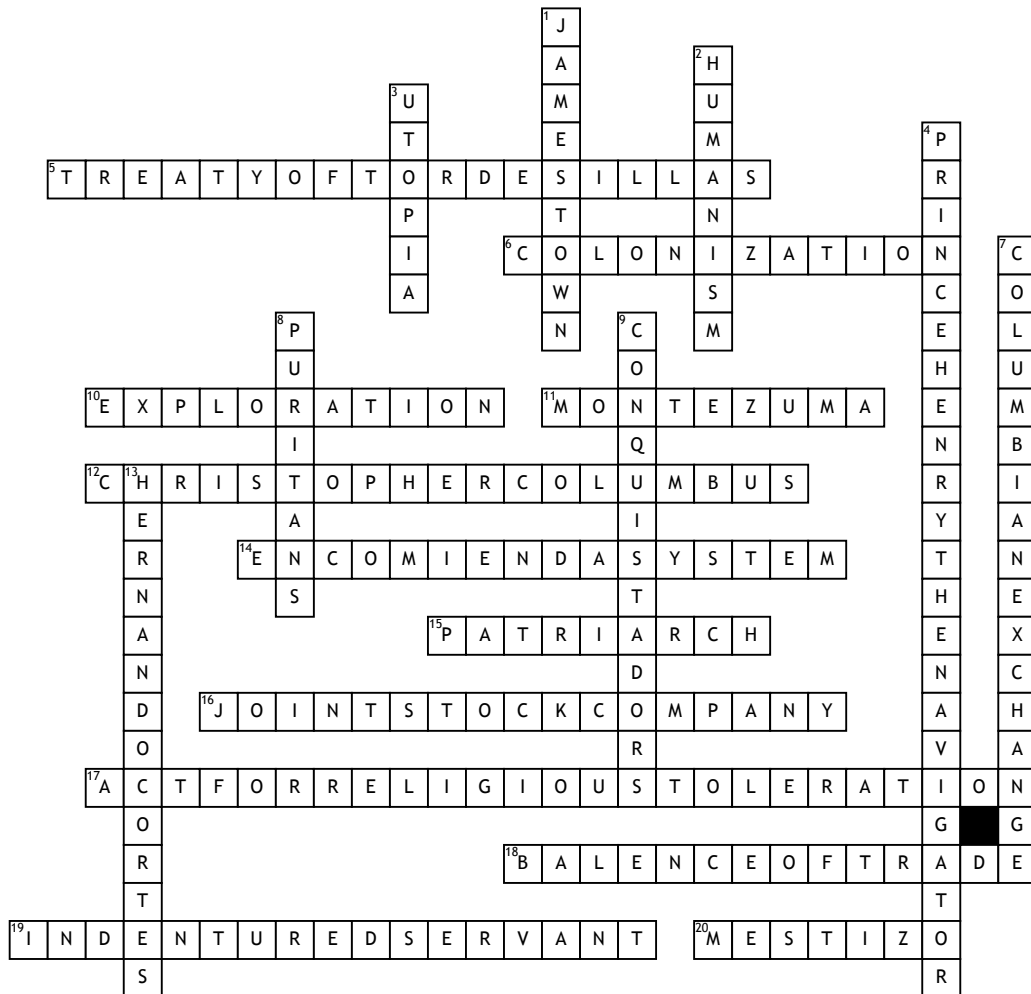


Exploration And Colonization
