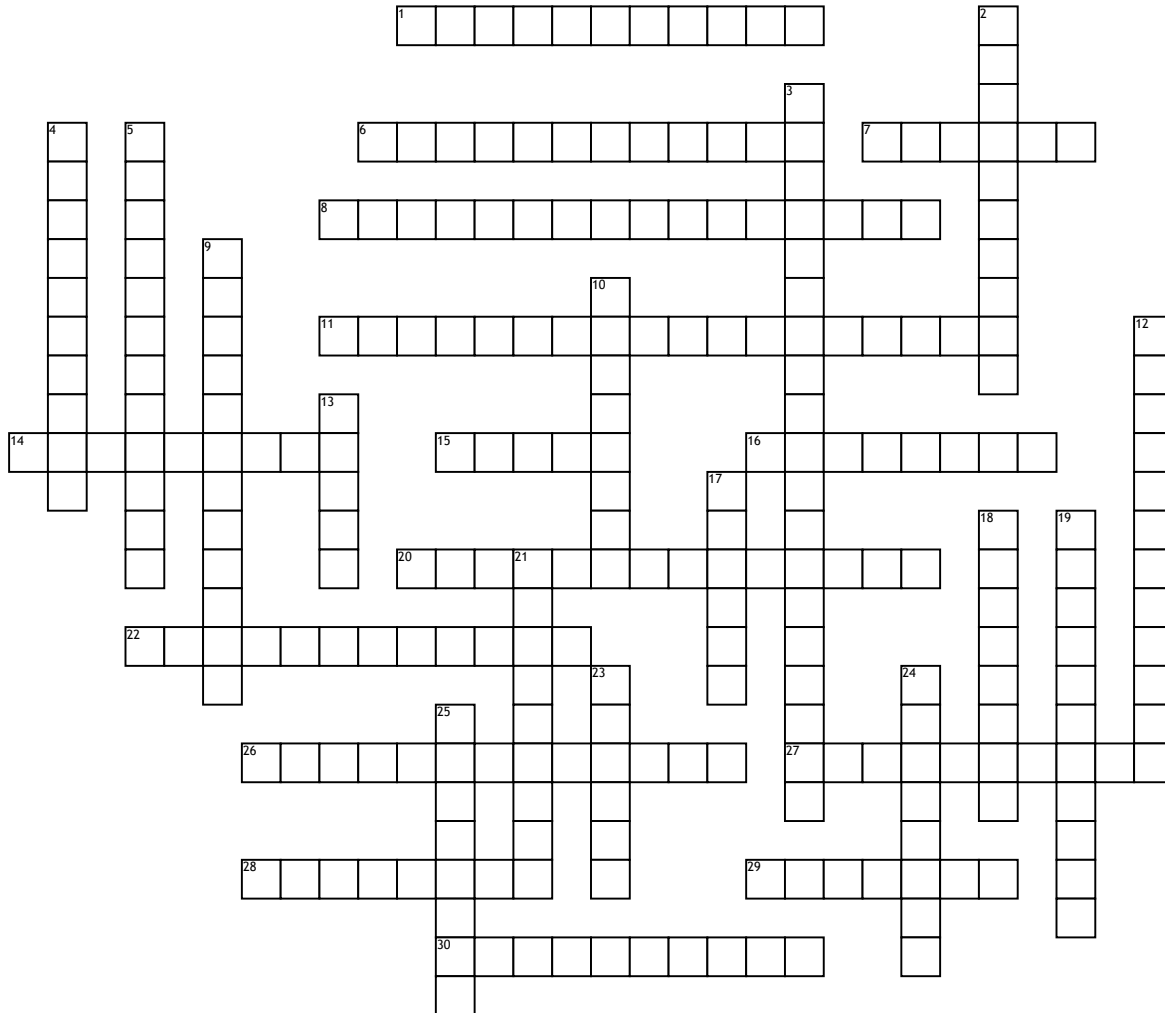

11. an effort by Congress to defuse the sectional and political rivalries triggered by the request of Missouri late in 1819 for admission as a state in which slavery would be permitted

14. an American abolitionist who believed armed insurrection was the only way to overthrow the institution of slavery in the United States

20. was an American politician who was at U.S. Representative and Senator from Mississippi
