
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Different Mental Disorders

- **2.** A mental disorder marked by alternating periods of elation and depression.
- 8. An anxiety disorder in which an individual experiences excessive anxiety regarding separation from home or from people to whom the individual has a strong emotional attachment
- **13.** A recurrent urge to steal, typically without regard for need or profit.
- **15.** A developmental disorder characterized by significant difficulties in social interaction and nonverbal communication.
- **16.** Defined as part of a spectrum of tic disorders, which includes provisional, transient and persistent (chronic) tics.
- **17.** An extreme or irrational fear or dislike of a specified thing or group.

- **19.** It is the most commonly diagnosed mental disorder of children. Children with this may be hyperactive and unable control their impulses, or they may have trouble paying attention.
- 20. A neurological disorder marked by sudden recurrent episodes of sensory disturbance, loss of consciousness, or convulsions, associated with abnormal electrical activity in the brain.

- **1.** A disorder characterized by abnormal or unusual behavior of the nervous system during sleep.
- 3. A feeling of worry, nervousness, or unease
- **4.** It is a chronic and severe mental disorder that affects how a person thinks, feels, and behaves.
- 5. A partial or total loss of memory.
- **6.** A condition characterized by an extreme tendency to fall asleep whenever in relaxing surroundings.
- 7. Feelings of severe despondency and dejection.

- **9.** Progressive mental deterioration that can occur in middle or old age, due to generalized degeneration of the brain.
- **10.** It is a mental health condition that's triggered by a terrifying event either experiencing it or witnessing it.
- 11. The inability to sleep.
- 12. A chronic or persistent disorder of the mental processes caused by brain disease or injury and marked by memory disorders, personality changes, and impaired reasoning.
- 14. A mental condition, present from early childhood, characterized by difficulty in communicating and forming relationships with other people and in using language and abstract concepts.
- 18. A mental disorder in which people have unwanted and repeated thoughts, feelings, ideas, sensations, and behaviors that drive them to do something over and over.
