
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Corsage & Boutonnière Preperation

- 6. Small branch bearing buds, flowers or berries
- 7. Supplies, methods and materials which designer use to place and hold flowers and foliage in an arrangement
- $\textbf{10.} \ \, \textbf{Stretchable tape which adheres to itself, used to lengthen and strengthen stems}$
- 15. Leaves or buds growing on the side of the main stem
- 17. Location within a design which attracts the most attention or the center of interest in a corsage, the focal point is where the largest flower is placed
- 20. Corsage wiring technique in which a wire is inserted through the calyx and bent downward along the stem
- 21. A small floral adornment worn by women; No. 3 and 24 to 28 gauge wire is the most commonly used in corasge
- 22. Straight or hook bladed knife used to cut floral stems
- 24. Cluster of flowers used to full spaces between larger flowers to creating depth

- **26.** Substance which is sprayed on the stems and leaves of plants to reduce the rate of transpiration I, or water loss
- 27. Used to support the flowers and help manipulation when constructing a coursage and boutnonniere

- Long, slender bladed scissors used to cut ribbon,wire,fabric and fine netting
- 2. Color scheme with used different hues and shades of one color
- 3. Leads or buds growing on the side of the main stem
- 4. Waterproof all-purpose tape
- **5.** Turned back portion of a jacket or coat which lays flat and is a continuance of the collar
- 8. Quick drying, water proof adhesive that will not brown leaves; available in liquid spray and tape forms
- **9.** Spring action handle with short blades used to cut heavy duty wire and coursage and boutonnière stems

- **11.** Used to cut through very thick or tough floral material with one cut
- **12.** Thin green wire used to strengthen and lengthen stems
- 13. Triangular shape
- 14. Smaller stem which attaches a leaf to the main stem
- **16.** Condition of a plant cell when it has absorbed the maximum amount of water
- **18.** Small underdeveloped shoot, leaf or flower located at the tip of a stem
- **19.** Floral adornment work by men and pinned onto the lapel of the jacket
- 23. Used to hide the mechanics in a flower arrangement, commonly stems with lots of leaves and green materials, also referred to as greenery
- **25.** The bottom part of the flower bud or blossom, consisting of the outermost sepals; using wider than the stem and green
