
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Music Terminology

- 1. short melodic phrase repeated throughout a composition,
- **4.** a sequence of single notes that is musically satisfying; a tune
- 10. lowest singing voice
- 11. the representation of music through the use of visual symbols
- **12.** orchestrate or arrange (a piece of music), typically for a specified instrument or instruments
- 13. a strong, regular repeated pattern of movement or sound
- **14.** the quality of a sound governed by the rate of vibrations producing it; the degree of highness or lowness of a tone

- **15.** a continually repeated musical phrase or rhythm.
- **16.** a note having the time value of two crotchets or half a semibreve, represented by a ring with a stem.
- 17. the highest singing voice.

- **2.** (especially in church music) the highest adult male singing voice (sometimes distinguished from the countertenor voice as using falsetto).
- **3.** short melodic phrase repeated throughout a composition, sometimes slightly varied or transposed to a different pitch

- **5.** a note having the time value of an eighth of a semibreve or half a crotchet, represented by a large dot with a hooked stem.
- 6. a note having the time value of two minims or four crotchets, represented by a ring with no stem. It is the longest note now in common
- **7.** a creative work, especially a poem or piece of music
- **8.** a singing voice between baritone and alto or countertenor, the highest of the ordinary adult male range.
- **9.** a note having the time value of a quarter of a semibreve or half a minim, represented by a large solid dot with a plain stem.
