
## Latin American music



## <u>Across</u>

**3.** A tall instument that is made out of wood, it can make a catchy beat when played fast.

7. A ten-stringed mandolin of Andean regions with a sound box traditionally fashioned from the shell of an armadillo or tortoise, now also made of wood.

8. These instuments make sound when shaken.

**9.** This instument is large, it is played with a drum stick

**12.** This instument is played when it is hit, shaken or scraped

**13.** An instrument consisting of a series of ten or more tubes of different lengths, typically closed at the bottom and open at the top. The instrument is played by blowing across the open end at the top.

**14.** A small idiophone with two holes on the side, it is played by being scraped.

**15.** To cause to make a quick succession of short percussive sounds. This instument is filled with seeds, pebbles or beads

## <u>Down</u>

**1.** Two small idiophone made out of wood that are mostly common in Mexico.

**2.** A recorderlike Andean flute having a notched mouthpiece.

**4.** A pair of tunable single-headed, metal-shelled cylindrical drums, used in Latin American music

5. This instument is made out of meatal, it has two points for a different pitch.

6. Plural form of clave. Claves are a percussion instrument, consisting of two sticks or blocks, in which one is struck against the other in order to produce a sound.

**10.** This instument only has one pitch of sound, they only make sound when they are struck.

11. A pair of small drums of Cuban origin, played by beating with the hands.
