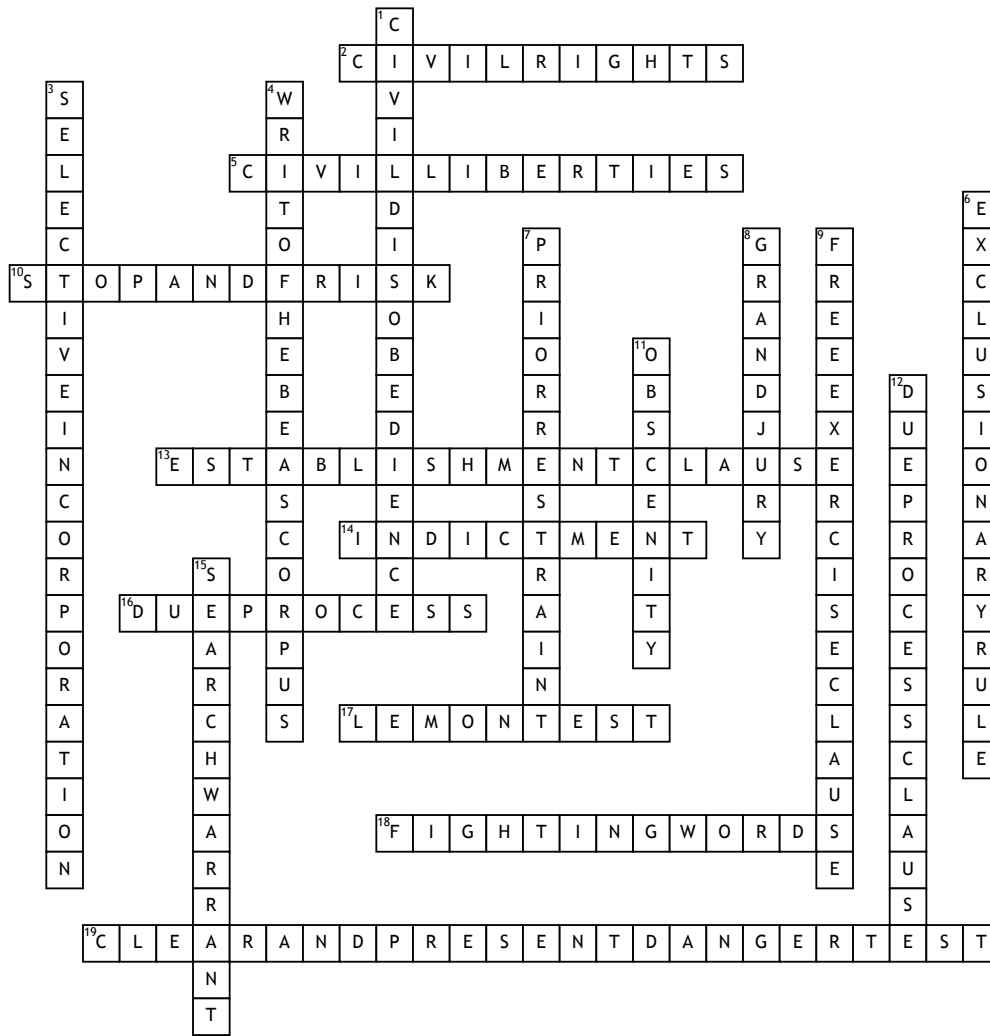


# civil liberties and civil rights

- 2. a class of rights that protect individuals' freedom from infringement by governments, social organizations, and private individuals.
- 5. personal freedoms are personal guarantees and freedoms that the government cannot abridge, either by law or by judicial interpretation, without due process.
- 10. Department practice of temporarily detaining, questioning, and at times searching civilians on the street for weapons and other contraband.
- 13. first Amendment of the US Constitution that prohibits the establishment of religion by Congress.
- 14. a thing that serves to illustrate that a system or situation is bad and deserves to be condemned.
- 16. air treatment through the normal judicial system, especially as a citizen's entitlement.

- 17. the Supreme Court heard the case of Lemon v Kurtzman (403 US 602).
- 18. words indicating a willingness to fight or challenge someone.
- 19. a doctrine adopted by the Supreme Court of the United States to determine under what circumstances limits can be placed on First Amendment freedoms of speech, press, or assembly.

- 3. a constitutional doctrine that ensures states cannot enact laws that take away the constitutional rights of American citizens that are enshrined in the Bill of Rights.
