

- 9. Ready-to-Wear- Clothing that is factory-produced in standard sizes. From the French phrase "prêt-à-porter," it refers to any clothing that is not custom-made. Everyone makes it, from fashion houses like Christian Dior to contemporary brands like

- 10. Lookbook- A compilation of images, showcasing a designer's upcoming collection. These are useful if you're a brand that doesn't have a runway show, but wants to present their collection in an artistic way. It's also a helpful outlet to show ways to style the product, which translates to customers buying said
- 12. Belt Bag- A small pouch that is either attaches to a belt or comes with its own strapand is worn around the waist. A higher end version of a fanny
- 13. Bias Cut- A garment that is cut diagonally. Because the fabric is cut diagonally ("on the bias"), the fabric clings and cascades over curves. This distinctively '90s dress style evokes memories of style icons from that
