2. overweight pregnant women may need this during labour as they are more likely to have an instrumental delivery

9. mothers who are obese are at increase risk their baby being born before its delivery date

10. serum marker that is raised in down's syndrome pregnancies

11. hypertension, proteinuria are signs of this condition

13. when a fertilised egg implants itself outside the womb - usually in the fallopian tubes

14. a pregnant woman is at higher risk than normal (20%->25%) of having one of these under 12 weeks if they are obese

15. diagnostic for down's syndrome if beyond 15 weeks, sample of fluid surrounding the baby is taken via abdomen

<u>Down</u>

1. a condition where there is too much glucose in the patients blood that only affects pregnant women

3. serum marker that is low in down's syndrome pregnancies

4. 15-20% of pregnant women are this category

5. women are offered this if the down's syndrome tests are positive6. BMI >30 has increased risk of still

birth of something in 100

7. test for screening for down's syndrome using a blood sample (10-14wks) and ultrasound (11wk+2d -14wks)

8. mothers are screened for this condition of their babies, but the results do not give a definitive diagnosis. the older the mother the more at risk the baby is of having this condition

12. a diagnostic test for down's syndrome which takes a small amount of placenta which is attached to the uterus out via abdomen or cervix
