

- 1. An attempt made by congress to "talk the bill to death".
- **4.** Aptly described the conference committees as a "Third house of Congress".
- **9.** A proposed law presented to the house or senate for consideration.
- **10.** A provision that will not normally pass on it's own, so it must piggyback on another provision
- **12.** Bills that contain many smaller issues.
- 13. A limit to the debates.

- **14.** Refusal by the president to sign a bill, returning it to the house.
- **15.** Regularly referring to an adoption of a new law, or amendment to an existing rule.
- **16.** Majority of the full membership of the house.
- **17.** A senator known very well for his use of the filibuster, speaking for over 15 hours.

2. Deals with matters where the house and senate must work together, without a president's signature.

- **3.** Enables members of the committee to push a bill onto the floor that has remained in committee for 30 days.
- **5.** Set the individual record for a filibuster, talking for 24 hours and 18 minutes trying to deny the civil rights act of 1957.
- **6.** Deals with unusual and temporary matters.
- **7.** A bill that is buried, dies in committee.
