

- Jefferson's political party; feared a strong central government
 - Army captain appointed by President Jefferson to explore the Louisiana Territory and lands in the west to the Pacific Ocean
 - A device that separates kernels of wheat from their husks
 - The act of seizing by force; The British impressed, or kidnapped, about 6,000 American Sailors
 - Shoshone woman who assisted the Lewis and Clark expedition
 - Inventor of America's first widely successful steamboat
 - Practice of forcing someone to act in a certain way by use of pressure or threats
 - Inventor of the telegraph
 - Political party of Hamilton and Adams; supported a strong central government
 - Person who takes extreme political positions
 - Chief justice of the Supreme Court appointed by President John Adams
 - Leader of a Southern expedition in the Louisiana Territory
 - principle that states that the Supreme Court has the final say in interpreting the Constitution
 - The economic changes of the late 1700s, when manufacturing replaced farming as the main form of work
 - Naval officer who led the U.S. victory over the British on Lake Erie
 - Co leader of the Lewis and Clark expedition
 - Shawnee chief who sought to stop the loss of Native American land to white settlers
 - western who supported the War of 1812
 - Third president of the United States
 - Group that explored the Louisiana Territory and lands west; also known as the Corps of Discovery
 - American Purchase of the Louisiana Territory from France
 - A device that cuts grain
 - Law that forbade American ships from sailing to foreign ports and closed American ports to British ships
 - method of production using many workers and machines in one building
 - law that let President John Adams fill federal judgeships with Federalists
 - Builder of America's first successful steam-powered locomotive
 - Payment in exchange for protection
 - Textile mills located in the factory town of Lowell, Massachusetts
 - Builder of the first waterpowered textile mill in America
 - A number of people acting together for a similar purpose
