

- 9. Water on the course that is not a water hazard (such as puddles after rain)
- 10. Turning the club face slightly inward to hook the ball or prevent a slice
- 11. Designated carriageway for carts
- 12. Another name for a 2 wood
- 13. One under par for the hole
- 15. Another name for a 2 iron
- 18. The path a putt must follow over a contour in the green to go to the hole
- 19. One over par on a hole
