

- **6.** A men's hat with the brim turned up in 3 places.
- **10.** Armor to protect the neck.
- **14.** Shorter pants, often woven from linen.
- 15. Men's cap worn at home.
- 17. Lightweight lace or silk scarf.
- **18.** The part of the hose covering the lower leg.
- **19.** Close-fitting 16th century helmet with cheek guards.

- **20.** Bombarde or ducal sleeves gathered at the wrist to create a bag around the arm.
- 22. Men's leather breeches.
- **23.** A bonnet that was fashionable in the 1830's.

- 1. Knot of hair arranged at the top of the head.
- 2. Short cloak from ancient Greece.
- 3. Style of cuffs on a man's coat in the 1700s.
- 4. A mail shirt.

- 7. Women's hairstyle popular in the late 1820's and 30's in which the hair is dressed on the crown of the head topped off with vertical loops of stiffened, often plaited hair.
- **8.** Wide sleeves on an outergarment.
- 9. A style of paned women's sleeve.
- 11. Roman ankle-high shoes.
- **12.** Close-fitting, ankle length garment.
- **13.** Italian rounded, semiconical cap with turned up brim or no brim at all.
- **16.** A women's dress fashionable during the 1770's and 80's.
- **21.** Worn over armor.
