

- **3.** a biological community of interacting organisms and their physical environment.

- **4.** political and spiritual leader during India's struggle with Great Britain for home rule; an advocate of passive resistance (1869-1948)
- **5.** a country in SE Asia, comprising the former states of Annam, Tonkin, and Cochin-China: formerly part of French Indochina; divided into North Vietnam and South Vietnam during the Vietnam War but now reunified. 126,104 sq
- **6.** a bomb that derives its destructive power from the rapid release of nuclear energy by fission of heavy atomic nuclei, causing damage through heat, blast, and radioactivity.
