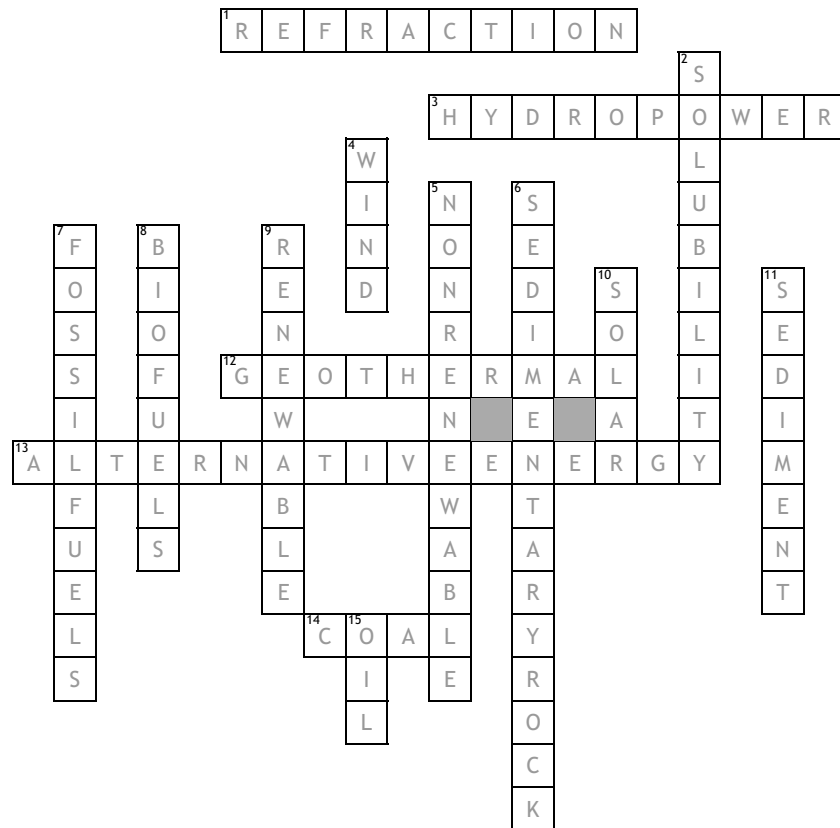


Natural Resources

- lenses cause objects to appear enlarged
- electricity generated using the energy of fast flowing water
- heat from the below earth's surface used to heat homes and produce electricity
- Energy generated from natural resources—such as sunlight, wind, plants, water and geothermal heat—which are clean renewable
- fossil fuel made from the remains of swamp plants

Down

- the ability to dissolve
- wind turbines convert wind into electricity
- a resource that takes a long time to be replenished
- rock formed by the deposit of sediments that undergo pressure over time
- materials formed from decayed remains of ancient plants and animals that are burned to produce heat; coal, oil, and natural gas
- energy produced from living organisms and used for fuel in vehicles
- a resource that can be replaced in a short amount of time
- energy from the sun used to produce electricity
- pieces of rock that have been broken down by weathering
- fossil fuel made from the remains of sea plants and animals
